

STUDENT SPEAKER

Saad Al-Tami is a candidate for a Master of Arts in International Affairs at the Elliott School. Having grown up in the Middle East, Saad developed a deep interest in conflict, conflict resolution, and international security, particularly in his home region. Saad started his professional journey early, in 2008, as the host of a children's educational television show in Kuwait. In 2014, Saad received national recognition when he campaigned and was elected to represent Kuwaiti students in the Kuwaiti parliament on matters related to education. He later pursued higher education and graduated cum laude and Beta Gamma Sigma from the University of Toledo in 2019 with a Bachelor of Business Administration in Finance. During his time at Elliott, Saad produced an educational video series designed to educate Arabic speakers about International Relations theories and schools of thought.

KEYNOTE ADDRESS

Congressman Gregory Meeks, Chairman of the House Committee on Foreign Affairs, has been a U.S. representative from New York since 1998. He has chaired the House Committee on Foreign Affairs since 2021. Now in his thirteenth term in Congress, Chairman Meeks has devoted his energy and skill to serving one of the most diverse constituencies in the nation. He is known for being an effective, principled, and common sense leader. He is the first black Member of Congress to serve as Chair of the House Committee On Foreign Affairs. Meeks is a multilateralist with decades of experience in foreign policy. He believes that the United States should build coalitions around our interests and work with other countries to build a stable and prosperous future.

Congressman Meeks knew in his early years that he wanted to be a lawyer. He was inspired by a mother and father who worked hard to ensure that their children would have opportunities for advancement that they never did. Meeks' parents passed on to him a profound sense of social justice, commitment to community, and willingness to extend a helping hand to those in need. He attended Adelphi University where he earned a bachelor's degree in history and received his JD degree from Howard University Law School.

HARRY HARDING TEACHING AWARD AND CHARGE TO GRADUATES

The Harry Harding Teaching Award is given to a member of the Elliott School faculty who has demonstrated sustained excellence in teaching and has made extraordinary contributions to the education of Elliott School students.

Gregg A. Brazinsky is Professor of History and International Affairs and serves as the director of the Asian Studies Program, acting director of the Sigur Center for Asian Studies, and acting codirector of the East Asia National Resource Center. He is the author of two books: Nation Building in South Korea: Koreans, Americans, and the Making of a Democracy and Winning the Third World: Sino-American Rivalry during the Cold War. He has received numerous fellowships to support his research and currently serves as the director of the George Washington Cold War Group.

As director of the Asian Studies Program, Professor Brazinsky has attracted some of the brightest students from around the country and the world who share a commitment to pursuing careers related to Asia. He helped to launch a special mentoring program for Asian Studies MA students and has worked to expand fellowship and professional opportunities for students in the program.

The Distinguished Scholar Award is awarded to an undergraduate based on academic achievement, independent research and scholarly initiative, leadership and involvement in extracurricular activities, participation in co-curricular experiences, and honors and/or awards received.

Cynthia Yue is a candidate for a Bachelor of Arts degree in International Affairs with a concentration in International Economics. As a UNICEF Youth Ambassador, she helped reinforce the European Union's commitment to child welfare and launched a youth advocacy campaign at the UN General Assembly that amassed over 450 million engagements. Currently, she also serves as one of thirty youth representatives in the Biden-Harris Administration and MTV's inaugural White House Mental Health Youth Action Forum. This fall, Cynthia will attend Harvard University as an MPP candidate.
