KEYNOTE ADDRESS

Carol Spahn was sworn into office as the 21st Director of the Peace Corps on December 21, 2022. Director Spahn brings more than 25 years of public and private sector experience. She has worked in countries around the world on issues ranging from small business development and infectious disease prevention to women's empowerment. She most recently served as the Peace Corps' chief executive officer and, prior to that, as acting director. Previously, Director Spahn was also the Peace Corps' chief of operations in the Africa Region and the country director of Peace Corps/Malawi. Director Spahn was senior vice president of operations at Women for Women International, an organization serving marginalized and socially excluded women in conflict-affected countries. Before that, Director Spahn served as executive director of Accordia Global Health Foundation, a nonprofit focused on creating sustainable centers of excellence in health in Africa. She served as vice president, chief financial officer, and treasurer of Small Enterprise Assistance Funds, a nonprofit private equity fund manager that invests in small- and medium-sized companies in developing countries. She has also held positions at leading private sector institutions, including GE Capital and KPMG Peat Marwick.

Director Spahn holds a bachelor's degree from the Catholic University of America and a master's in international development from the George Washington University Elliott School of International Affairs.

HARRY HARDING TEACHING AWARD AND CHARGE TO GRADUATES

The Harry Harding Teaching Award is given to a member of the Elliott School faculty who has demonstrated sustained excellence in teaching and has made extraordinary contributions to the education of Elliott School students.

Steven M. Suranovic is a Professor of Economics and International Affairs at the Elliott School. He has been a faculty member at George Washington University since 1988 and has served several terms as the Director of the International Economic Policy M.A. program. Professor Suranovic has published in numerous academic journals, including the *Journal of International Economics*, the *Canadian Journal of Economics*, *World Economy*, and the *Journal of Health Economics*. His books include “A Moderate Compromise: Policy Choice in an Era of Globalization, Palgrave-Macmillan,” published in January 2011, which offers a critique of current methods of policy evaluation and choice and suggests a simple, principled and moderate alternative, and “International Economics: Theory and Policy, Flat World Knowledge,” published in May 2010, an international economics textbook.

Professor Suranovic teaches principles of microeconomics, international trade, and international finance theory and policy. In the fall of 2002, he taught as a visiting Fulbright lecturer at Sichuan University in Chengdu, China. Since 2009 he has taught summer study abroad classes for GW students at Fudan University in Shanghai. He has also spoken to business, government, and academic audiences in Japan, Malaysia, the Philippines, China, and Mongolia as part of the U.S. State Department’s speaker programs.

2023 ELLIOTT SCHOOL PRIZE AND AWARD WINNERS

The Distinguished Scholar Award is awarded to an undergraduate based on academic achievement, independent research and scholarly initiative, leadership and involvement in extracurricular activities, participation in co-curricular experiences, and honors and/or awards received.

Meghan Sullivan, from Burlington, Connecticut, is a candidate for the Bachelor of Arts degree with a major in international affairs, concentrating on comparative political, economic, and social systems and international development. Meghan did outstanding research as part of the Elliott School Dean's Scholars program on the Thai-Myanmar border—this research has been accepted for presentation at a conference, with a plan to publish. She has also already published two previous pieces of research regarding Southeast Asia in *The Diplomat*. Meghan is a member of the Leadership, Ethics, And Practice (LEAP) Student Advisory Board, a development officer for Delta Phi Epsilon Professional Foreign Service Sorority, a member of No Lost Generation, and participated in the Elizabeth J. Somers Women's Leadership Program. Meghan has received several accolades, including the GW Undergraduate Research Award, the United Nations Foundation Sustainable Development Challenge Undergraduate Winner, and the Connecticut Challenge to Educational Citizenship Award.

The Wilbur J. Carr Memorial Award is awarded to one undergraduate and one graduate student who demonstrates outstanding ability in the study of international affairs while displaying the qualities necessary to be a good citizen and dedicated public servant.

Diana Pacheco is a candidate for a Bachelor of Arts in international affairs with a concentration in comparative political, economic, and social systems and a minor in economics. Throughout her time at GW, she helped launch a family business, interned for Rise Against Hate, and served as vice president of the GW Undergraduate Moot Court team. Diana earned certifications in Immigrant Advocacy and Accompaniment with the Villanova Interdisciplinary Immigration Studies Training for Advocates (VIISTA) to become a reliable source of information for immigrants in her community. In the Spring 2021 semester, she published her law review article titled "A Reimagination of the US Immigration Court System: Lessons Re-Learned After Four Years of Deepening Anti-Immigrant Sentiment" with the Columbia Undergraduate Law Review Journal. Diana worked as a student administrative assistant for the GW Law this past year. After graduation, she plans to attend law school.

Suzanne Claeys is a candidate for a Master of Arts in security policy studies with a concentration in science and technology. She was a recipient of an Elliott School Graduate Fellowship, and during her time at GW, she worked full-time for the Project on Nuclear Issues at the Center for Strategic and International Studies, where she managed the European Trilateral Nuclear Dialogues. Suzanne has also published articles and reports on the future of arms control in an era of strategic competition, including the influential Integrated Arms Control Report.

The John Henry Cowles Prize is awarded to an undergraduate student who combines overall scholastic achievement with leadership potential.

Ethan Goldblatt is a fall 2022 graduate with a Bachelor of the Arts in international affairs, concentrating on conflict resolution and a minor in peace studies. Ethan also completed the University Honors Program and Global Bachelors program, studying abroad in Belfast and Vienna. He interned at the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of International Organization Affairs, focusing on global health during the COVID-19 pandemic. Ethan also worked as an intern at the Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe's Parliamentary Assembly, researching Russian human rights violations during the early months of the war in Ukraine. He capped off his Elliott School experience with a senior thesis research project on the discordance between national and international positions on LGBTI rights among UN member states. He plans to pursue a graduate degree in international affairs to further prepare for a career in international service.

The Norman H. Friend Prize is awarded to an undergraduate who combines overall scholastic achievement with leadership potential.

Sua Cho Jung is a candidate for a Bachelor of Arts degree in international affairs with a concentration in international politics and Spanish with a minor in history. While at GW, she interned with the National Legal Aid & Defender Association, DC Volunteer Lawyers Project, and Curtin Law Roberson Dunigan & Salans, a law firm specializing in business, tax, and trust and estate administration. On campus, she was an active panel member of the University Integrity and Conduct Council with the Students Rights and Responsibilities office, No Lost Generation GWU, and The Store, GW's student-led food pantry, where she served as President (2022) and Senior Advisor (2023). As a native Spanish speaker, she worked on a thesis project for the Spanish department about the role of language in creating national identity in Mexico. Following graduation, Sua looks forward to attending law school and pursuing a law career.
